He has worked in a number of Commonwealth health systems including the UK, Australia, Singapore and New Zealand, and is committed to empowering people to recognise and respond to serious infection and sepsis. To this end, he co-founded the New Zealand Sepsis Trust in 2018, and submitted his doctoral thesis on "The Sepsis Syndrome: aspects of epidemiology, cost, and outcome in Aotearoa New Zealand"
